

#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### **School Organization**

#### 1. Student Population

Currently at 247 students in-person and 26 online for a total of 498 students. We continue to have movement of students in and out of the school.

• Mr. Rossit, who was previous declared surplus, has now been recalled back to the school

### Literacy and Numeracy & Excellence in Student Achievement

#### 1. School Focus - Mathematics:

We continue to focus on mathematical fluency and high impact strategies that include descriptive feedback, learning goals, and success criteria as well as direct instruction. We continue to devote part of our staff meetings to this professional development.

#### 2. EQAO - Gr. 3 & 6

The provincial assessments in language and mathematics have begun for Grade 6 students. The format has changed, and the assessment will be digital with the option of pencil and paper. The dates for the assessments are as follows:

These classes have been going well. Classes are taking place for eight weeks, twice weekly until 5:00pm. These tutoring sessions are led by Ms. Vien, Ms. Bujeya, Mrs. Gibson, and Ms. Macri.

#### **Book Fair**

Our first Scholastic Book Fair in almost two years was very successful. We sold approximately \$6000.00 worth of materials, which nets the school approximately \$1500.00. Thank you to all parents/guardians for their support, and all the parent volunteers who came out to help!

#### 6. Student Activities

- a. Sports: Congratulations to our Intermediate Co-Ed Soccer Team for winning the tournament!
- b. Clubs are active at our school: Rosary Club, Eco Schools, and Morning Announcements, Choir, and Chess Club for Junior/Intermediate
- c. Finally! The yearbook link is ready and was sent to parents today and posted in the Google Classrooms. The cost of the yearbook is \$25.00.

#### Health & Safety

1. Fire Drills and Lockdown Practices: We will be having our second Lockdown practice in a few weeks. We will be having our next set of Fire Drills in June, including hold & secure practice.
