

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

School Organization

1. Student Population

Currently at 468 students in-person and 27 online for a total of 495 students. We continue to have movement of students in and out of the school.

2. Staffing

• Ms. Palmateer, who was previous declared surplus, has now been recalled back to the school

Literacy and Numeracy & Excellence in Student Achievement

1. School Focus - Mathematics:

We continue to focus on mathematical fluency and high impact strategies that include descriptive feedback, learning goals, and success criteria as well as direct instruction. We have been devoting part of our staff meetings to this professional development.

2. EOAO – Gr. 3 & 6

The provincial assessments in language and mathematics will take place this year for both Grade 3 and Grade 6 students. The format has changed, and the assessment will be digital with the option of pencil and paper. The dates for the assessments are as follows:

3. In-School Tutors

Students in FDK to Gr. 8 have been chosen by teachers to receive intensive support in mathematics and language. The board is providing coverage for supply teachers to be in classes while teachers withdraw students for this support. This will take place over the next several months.

4. After-School Tutors

All schools are providing after school tutoring support for in small classes of anywhere from 12-15 students. Classes will take place for eight weeks, twice weekly until 5:00pm. These tutoring sessions are led by Ms. Vien, Ms. Bujeya, Mrs. Gibson, and Ms. Macri.

5. Student Activities

- a. Sports: soccer, with tryouts for intermediate co-ed will be starting soon
- b. Clubs will resume at our school: they currently include Rosary Club, Eco Schools, and Morning Announcements, Choir, and Chess Club for Junior/Intermediate
- c. Graduation photos were successful and took place on Thursday, February 24th.

Health & Safety

- 1. Fire Drills and Lockdown Practices: We have already had our first Lockdown practice. We will be having our next set of Fire Drills in the next month for the second term, including hold & secure practice.
- 2. Student and Staff Safety COVID protocols: Due to changes in Peel Public Health measures for schools and board expectations around COVID safety for students and staff. Some items may vary in schools as they are site-specific depending on the school community and location. Parent(s)/Guardian(s) and staff continue to report results from COVID self-screening daily this includes positive testing results.
- 3. **Kiss & Ride Expectations:** Improvements have been noted with greater compliance of rules and expectations as observed from parents. Thank you to all those who are supportive of our rules and expectations.
- 4. **COVID Vaccination Clinic:** Our school was chosen to be a pilot for a Vaccine Clinic put on by Peel Public Health on January 27th and further clinics were held on March 9 and March 22. They were all deemed great successes by Peel Public Health.

Catholic Community, Culture and Caring

1. Sacramental Dates

2. ShareLife

Our ShareLife fundraising committee has been formed and is led by Mrs. Antezza, Mrs. Salema, Ms. Bunde, and Mrs. Mauricette-Skyers. We have put out notices for the sale of Ice Dawgs and lactose-free/gluten options will also be made available for students with allergies. Thank you to our families and students for their continued support.

3. Bullying Awareness and Prevention

• Virtues of Kindness and Love: We continue to use the virtues of Kindness and Love with students to spread the message of inclusion, safety, and care in our school community. We continue to see the support of parents to be aware of our efforts to have students learn to be problem-solvers and to also learn the differences between conflict and bullying. Thank you to our teachers and staff for their continued support of our students in this regard.

4. Eco-Schools

- Many of the classes have signed up for workshops offered by the Region of Peel that support education of
 our students on good environmental practices, energy conservation, and waste management. These are
 offered throughout the school year on a variety of topics.
- As we continue to work on ways for our school community to be good stewards of our environment our Eco-Teams have been formed and are run by division. Our application for our annual Eco-School certification has been completed. We continue to submit items to our digital portfolio Many thanks to Mrs. Lopez, Ms. Vien, and Mr. Rossit for their leadership.
- School Grounds Clean-Up Day April 22, 2022: Our Eco-Team is leading a school-wide grounds clean-up. With gloves and garbage bags, students will work to tidy up the school grounds on a special day dedicated to this activity. Classes are signing up for an area and time of day to do so.
